Read the following excerpt from a novel and answer the questions:

"As I stepped off the train and onto the platform, the cool mountain air enveloped me, a welcome respite from the sweltering heat of the city. The trees towered above, their leaves rustling in the breeze, and the sound of the river bubbled in the distance. I felt a sense of peace wash over me, a sense of being home."

3. What themes might the author be exploring through this setting?


Group Discussion
