Noun Classification

Types of Nouns

Common Nouns

Generic names for people, places, things (e.g., teacher, city, book)

Proper Nouns

Specific names with capitalization (e.g., Sarah, New York, Microsoft)

Abstract Nouns

Conceptual ideas not physically tangible (e.g., love, freedom, courage)

Concrete Nouns

Physical objects that can be perceived by senses (e.g., chair, apple, computer)

Collective Nouns

Groups representing multiple entities (e.g., team, family, orchestra)

Compound Nouns

Nouns formed by combining multiple words (e.g., mother-in-law, toothbrush)

Verb Exploration

Verb Types and Characteristics

Verb Category	Description	Example
Action Verbs	Express physical or mental actions	run, think, create
Linking Verbs	Connect subject to additional information	is, seems, becomes
Helping Verbs	Assist main verbs in expressing tense	have, will, should
Irregular Verbs	Do not follow standard conjugation rules	go/went, be/was
