*This 30-minute diagnostic assessment is designed to evaluate the understanding of beginner level conversational English skills among students aged 18-25. The assessment aims to measure students' ability to understand basic English greetings and introductions, identify and use common vocabulary related to food and drink, and practice basic sentence structure and grammar rules.*

- 0 points for each question that demonstrates little or no understanding of language concepts

- 0 points for each incorrect match

- 1 point for each correct completion
- 0 points for each incorrect completion

### Section 5: Conversation Practice

- 2 points for each conversation that demonstrates clear understanding of language concepts
- 1 point for each conversation that demonstrates some understanding of language concepts
- 0 points for each conversation that demonstrates little or no understanding of language concepts
