

Introduction

This worksheet is designed to help students analyze and understand the characters in Romeo and Juliet. The activities and questions are aimed at promoting a deeper understanding of the play and its characters.

Section 1: Character Identification

Answer the following questions:

1. Who are the main characters in Romeo and Juliet?

2. Describe the relationship between Romeo and Juliet.

3. What are the character traits of Tybalt? How does he contribute to the plot?

Analyze the following relationships:

3. How does the feud between the Montagues and Capulets influence the characters' actions?

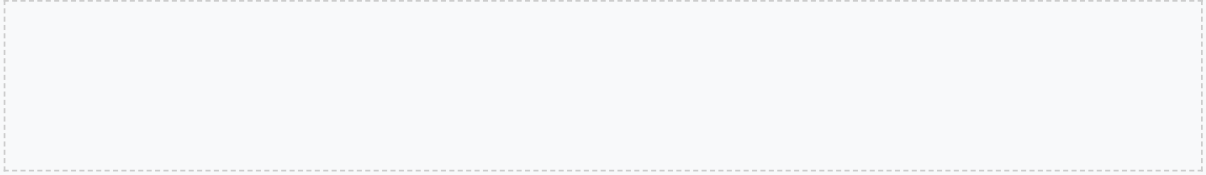
Section 3: Character Development

Analyze the following quotes:

1. Analyze the following quote: "What's in a name? That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet." (Juliet, Act 2, Scene 2) What does this quote reveal about Juliet's character?

2. What does the quote "Love is a smoke made with the fume of sighs" (Romeo, Act 1, Scene 1) reveal about Romeo's character?

3. Choose a quote from the play that illustrates the theme of conflict. Analyze the quote and explain its significance.

Section 5: Creative Writing

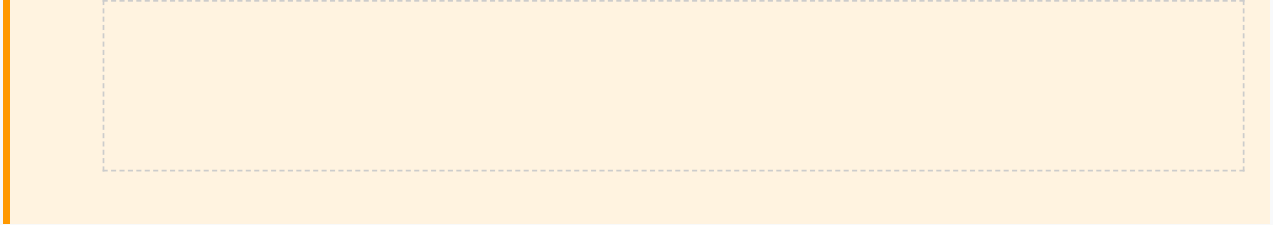
Choose one of the following activities:

1. Write a journal entry from the perspective of Romeo, exploring his thoughts and feelings about his love for Juliet.

2. Imagine you are Juliet, writing a letter to Romeo. What would you say to him?

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3. Write a scene between two characters of your choice, exploring their relationship and interactions.
