

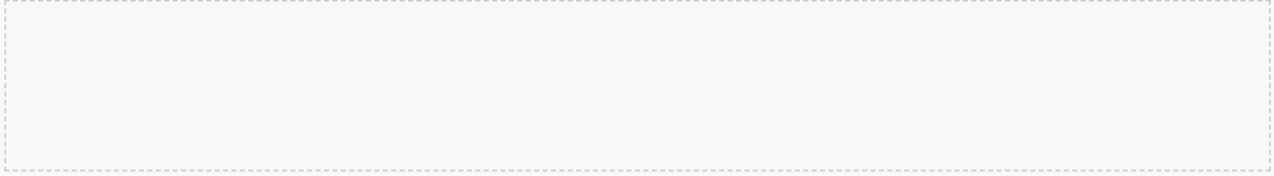
### Introduction to Fantasy Writing


