Marking Guide

The assessment will be marked based on the following criteria:

- Multiple Choice Questions: 1 point for each correct answer
- Short Answer Questions:
 - Error Analysis: 2 points for each correct identification and correction
 - Sentence Completion: 2 points for each grammatically correct completion
 - Grammar Explanation: 4 points for a clear, concise explanation
- Essay Question:
 - Content (40 points): Depth of understanding of the grammatical concept, relevance of examples
 - Organization and Coherence (20 points): Clarity, logical flow, and effective use of transitional phrases
 - Language Use (20 points): Accuracy in grammar, vocabulary, and spelling
 - Mechanics (20 points): Adherence to standard writing conventions, including punctuation and capitalization
