Section 3: Essay	
Write a short paragraph (5-7 sentences) using at least three common vocabulary words and demonstrating an understanding of basic sentence structures.	

Marking Guide

The assessment will be marked as follows:

- Multiple Choice: 1 point for each correct answer
- Short Answer: 2 points for each correct and complete answer
- Essay: 4 points for content, 2 points for organization and coherence, and 2 points for style and conventions

Differentiation Options
