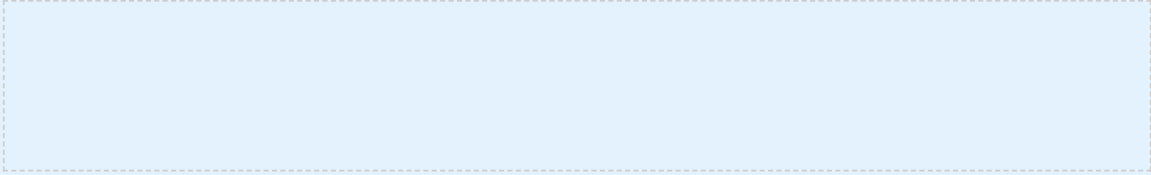

Marking Guide

The marking guide will consist of clear rubrics and answer keys to evaluate your performance. The assessment will be marked based on the following criteria:

- Short answer questions: accuracy and completeness of answers (40%)
- Essay question: clarity, coherence, and depth of analysis (30%)
- Project-based question: completeness and organization of the concept paper outline (30%)
