The activities and questions are aligned with the learning objectives of identifying and reading sight words, understanding basic sentence structures, recognizing and using correct punctuation, and demonstrating comprehension of short stories and poems.

Accuracy and fluency in reading sight words (20 points)

Understanding of basic sentence structures and punctuation (20 points)

Comprehension of short stories and poems (20 points)

Use of correct punctuation and grammar in written responses (20 points)

Creativity and coherence in written responses (20 points)

The assessment should be conducted in a quiet and comfortable environment, with minimal distractions.

# **Differentiation Options**

For students with visual impairments: large print or braille versions of the assessment, assistive technology to read the questions and tasks.

For students with hearing impairments: sign language interpreters or written instructions.

For English language learners: bilingual versions of the assessment, visual aids and graphic organizers to support comprehension.

For students with learning disabilities: extra time to complete the assessment, use of a scribe or assistive technology to complete written responses.
