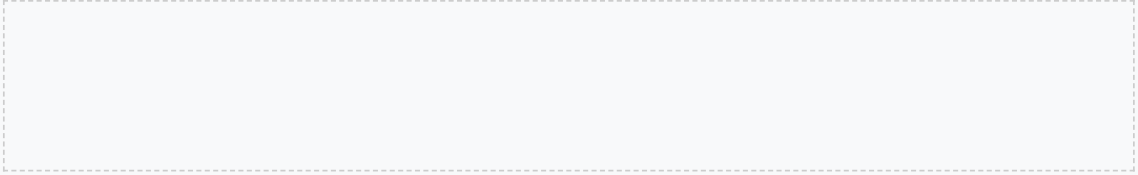

The cat is sleeping tight.


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Storytelling (20 minutes)


Storytelling is a great way to develop creativity and language skills. Let's create our own simple story with counting and rhymes!

2. Draw a picture to illustrate your story.




3. Share your story with a friend or family member.




Activities (20 minutes)

Let's have some fun with counting and rhymes!


1. Create a counting book with pictures and numbers.



2. Play a rhyming game with a friend or family member.




3. Act out a story that incorporates counting and rhymes.



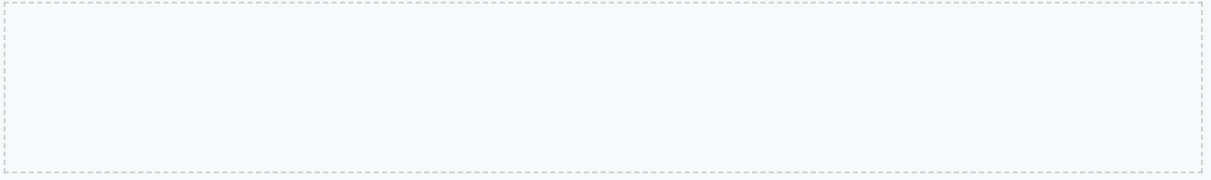
