



Introduction

Direct Instruction

Show students a diagram of a football field, pointing out the different positions and their locations. Explain the roles of each position, using simple language and examples. Use visual aids and videos to illustrate the concepts, making it easier for students to understand.

Defenders:

- Goalkeeper (GK)
- Defenders (DF)

Midfielders:

- Defensive Midfielder (DM)
- Central Midfielder (CM)
- Attacking Midfielder (AM)

Forwards:

- Left Forward (LW)
- Center Forward (CF)
- Right Forward (RW)

Team Roles:

- Captain
- Vice-Captain
- Team Manager



Guided Practice

Divide students into small groups and assign each group a specific position (e.g., defenders, midfielders, forwards). Ask them to work together to create a list of responsibilities and strategies for their assigned position.

Defenders:

- Defend the goal
- Block shots
- Tackle opponents

Midfielders:

- Support defenders
- Create scoring opportunities
- Control the tempo of the game

Forwards:

- Score goals
- Create scoring opportunities
- Press opponents

Team Roles:

- Lead the team
- Make tactical decisions
- Communicate with teammates



Independent Practice

Provide students with a handout containing a scenario-based activity, where they must decide which position would be best suited to a particular situation. Allow students to work individually, using their knowledge of player positions and team roles to make informed decisions.

Scenario 1:

- The opponent's team is attacking, and your team needs to defend the goal.
- Which position would be best suited to this situation?

Scenario 2:

- Your team is attacking, and you need to create a scoring opportunity.
- Which position would be best suited to this situation?



Game-Based Learning

Organize a simulated football game, where students can apply their knowledge of player positions and team roles in a fun and interactive way. Divide the class into teams and assign each student a position.

Team A:

- Goalkeeper (GK)
- Defenders (DF)
- Midfielders (MF)
- Forwards (FW)

Team B:

- Goalkeeper (GK)
- Defenders (DF)
- Midfielders (MF)
- Forwards (FW)



Conclusion and Reflection

Gather the students together to reflect on what they have learned. Ask them to share their experiences during the simulated game, highlighting successes and challenges. Emphasize the importance of teamwork, communication, and strategy in football, and how these skills can be applied to real-life situations.

Reflection Questions:

- What did you learn about player positions and team roles in football?
- How did you apply your knowledge of player positions and team roles during the simulated game?
- What challenges did you face, and how did you overcome them?

Assessment and Evaluation
