This worksheet is designed to evaluate your understanding of Shakespeare's play, with a focus on analyzing the plot and characters, identifying and explaining Shakespearean language and literary devices, demonstrating understanding of themes and relationships between characters, and evaluating the dramatic impact of key scenes and dialogue.

3. What is the dramatic impact of the scene where Claudio publicly shames Hero? How does this scene contribute to the overall meaning of the play?

Choose one of the following essay questions and answer it in 2-3 pages:

1. Analyze the character of Don John and his contribution to the plot. How does his character relate to the themes of deception and betrayal?

2. Discuss the theme of love in the play, using examples from the text to support your argument. How do the characters of Claudio and Hero relate to this theme?
