Project-Based Task:

- 5 points for a timeline that includes at least 5 significant events and demonstrates a clear understanding of the impact of espionage on global events
- 3 points for a timeline that includes 3-4 significant events and demonstrates a partial understanding of the impact of espionage on global events
- 1 point for a timeline that includes fewer than 3 significant events and demonstrates little or no understanding of the impact of espionage on global events
