Pre-Lesson Preparation

Room Setup:

- · Arrange desks in a U-shape to facilitate discussion and group work
- Set up a projector and screen for video presentation

Technology Needs:

- · Computer with internet access
- Projector and screen

Materials Preparation:

Detailed Lesson Flow

Pre-Class Setup (15 mins before)

Opening/Hook (10 mins)

- Ask students to take notes on key events and dates mentioned in the video

Engagement Strategies:

- Ask students to consider the impact of the Ottoman Empire's expansion on modern society
- Encourage students to ask questions and seek help if needed

Direct Instruction (20-25 mins)

- Provide a direct instruction on the factors that contributed to the Ottoman Empire's rise
- Show diagrams and maps to illustrate the empire's expansion

Checking for Understanding:

- Ask students to provide examples of the empire's military and administrative strategies
- · Have students work in pairs to match key events and dates with their corresponding descriptions

Guided Practice (25-30 mins)

- · Have students work in groups to complete a handout with guided questions related to the video
- · Circulate around the room to provide guidance and answer questions

Scaffolding Strategies:

- Provide additional support for ELL students by offering visual aids and simplified language
- Encourage students to use visual aids and diagrams to help them understand complex concepts

Independent Practice (20-25 mins)

- Have students complete a comprehension quiz on the Ottoman Empire's expansion

Introduction and Hook

Introduction:

The Ottoman Empire was one of the most powerful and influential empires in history, spanning over 600 years and covering much of Southeast Europe, Western Asia, and North Africa.

Hook:
