Pre-Lesson Preparation

Room Setup:

- Arrange desks in a U-shape to facilitate group discussions

Detailed Lesson Flow

- Circulate around the room to provide guidance and support as needed (5 minutes)

Scaffolding Strategies:

- Provide sentence stems to support writing
- Offer one-on-one support for struggling students

Independent Practice (20 minutes)

- Assign a case study of a local business (10 minutes)
- Have students present their findings to the class (5 minutes)
- Encourage peer feedback and discussion (5 minutes)

Assessment (10 minutes)

- Conclude with a class discussion on the importance of entrepreneurship (5 minutes)
- Have students complete a short written reflection on what they learned (5 minutes)



Differentiation & Support Strategies
