

## **Romeo and Juliet Character Analysis Worksheet**

## Introduction

Welcome to the Romeo and Juliet character analysis worksheet! This worksheet is designed for students aged 11-14 and caters to mixed ability differentiation, including foundation, core, and extension learners.

The purpose of this worksheet is to help students develop their critical thinking skills by analyzing the characters' motivations, relationships, and conflicts in William Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet.

## Page 1: Character Matching Game

Core Learners: Add more details to the web, including conflicts and motivations (e.g., Romeo and Tybalt's feud, Juliet's love for Romeo).
Extension Learners: Include additional characters and analyze their relationships and conflicts in more depth.

Debate the significance of each character's role in the play, using evidence from the text to support arguments:
<ul><li>1. Is Romeo's impulsive nature a strength or a weakness?</li><li>2. Is Tybalt's aggression justified or unjustified?</li><li>3. Is Juliet's decision to fake her own death a brave or foolish move?</li></ul>
Foundation Learners: Participate in a class discussion, sharing basic opinions and ideas.
Core Learners: Prepare and present arguments, using evidence from the play.
Extension Learners: Research and present alternative perspectives, including historical and cultural contexts.

Watch a scene from a film adaptation of Romeo and Juliet, analyzing the characters' interactions and relationships:
Choose a scene and answer the following questions:
