What are Phrases of Time?

Phrases of time are expressions used to indicate when actions take place, how often they occur, and how long they last.

- Expressions of frequency (e.g., daily, weekly, monthly)
- Expressions of duration (e.g., for, since, until)
- Expressions of sequence (e.g., first, next, then)

Why are Phrases of Time Important?

Phrases of time are essential for effective communication in English, as they help convey when actions take place, how often they occur, and how long they last.

- Improves clarity and precision in communication
- Enhances understanding and comprehension



What are Expressions of Frequency?

Expressions of frequency indicate how often an action occurs.

- Daily (e.g., I go to school every day)
- Weekly (e.g., I do my homework every week)
- Monthly (e.g., I get paid every month)

Examples of Expressions of Frequency

- I go to the gym every day.
- She studies for her exams every week.
- They have a family dinner every month.



What are Expressions of Duration?

Expressions of duration indicate how long an action lasts.

- For (e.g., I have been studying for three hours)
- Since (e.g., I have been living in this city since 2010)
- Until (e.g., I will be working until 5 pm)

Examples of Expressions of Duration

- I have been studying for three hours.
- She has been living in this city since 2010.
- They will be working until 5 pm.



What are Expressions of Sequence?

Expressions of sequence indicate the order in which actions occur.

- First (e.g., First, I will finish my homework)
- Next (e.g., Next, I will watch TV)
- Then (e.g., Then, I will go to bed)

Examples of Expressions of Sequence

- First, I will finish my homework. Next, I will watch TV. Then, I will go to bed.
- She will eat breakfast first, then she will brush her teeth.
- They will go to the park first, then they will go to the movies.
