



## Introduction to Nouns and Verbs

### What are Nouns and Verbs?

*Read the following definitions and examples:*

Nouns are words that refer to a person, place, thing, or idea. Examples of nouns include:

- Person: teacher, student, doctor
- Place: school, hospital, park
- Thing: book, chair, computer
- Idea: happiness, freedom, love

Verbs are words that express action, event, or state of being. Examples of verbs include:

- Action: run, jump, read
- Event: birthday, holiday, concert
- State of being: happy, tired, excited

### Importance of Understanding Nouns and Verbs

### What is Sentence Structure?

Sentence structure refers to the way words are arranged to form a sentence. A sentence typically consists of a subject (noun) and a predicate (verb). Understanding sentence structure is essential in language because it helps us communicate effectively.

1. What is the subject of a sentence?

2. What is the predicate of a sentence?

- The teacher writes.

### Examples of Compound Sentences

*Read the following examples of compound sentences:*

- I went to the store, and I bought some milk.
- The dog runs, and the cat sleeps.
