Detailed Lesson Flow

Implementation Steps

- Encourage the use of visual aids and technology

Scaffolding Strategies:

- Provide guidance and support
- Encourage peer feedback and review

Day 6: Conclusion and Reflection

- Conclude the lesson with a reflective activity
- Have students reflect on what they learned and how they can apply it

Day 7: Final Assessment and Evaluation

- Administer a comprehensive quiz to assess understanding
- Evaluate student progress and provide feedback

Job Type	Description	Requirements
Retail	Sales and customer service in stores	Good communication skills, availability to work flexible hours
Food Service	Working in restaurants, cafes, etc.	Ability to work under pressure, basic math skills
Internship	Practical experience in a specific field	Relevant coursework, strong application and interview skills
Volunteer	Unpaid work for social causes	Empathy, commitment, good time management
