### **Learning Objectives**

#### By the end of the lesson, students will be able to:

- Retell the main events of a story in their own words
- Identify and explain the meaning of new vocabulary
- Demonstrate an understanding of the VIPERS reading skills, including:
  - o Vocabulary: Understanding and using new words
  - o Inference: Making deductions based on the text
  - o Prediction: Forecasting what might happen next
  - Explanation: Clarifying and interpreting the text
  - o Retrieval: Locating and recalling information
  - o Summarising: Condensing the main points



### **Background Information**

Whole Class Reading is an approach that involves the teacher reading a text aloud to the class, followed by discussions, questions, and activities to promote comprehension and engagement.

VIPERS is an acronym that represents the six key reading skills:

#### Skill Description

- V Vocabulary: Understanding and using new words
- I Inference: Making deductions based on the text
- P Prediction: Forecasting what might happen next
- E Explanation: Clarifying and interpreting the text
- R Retrieval: Locating and recalling information
- S Summarising: Condensing the main points



### **Teaching Tips**

#### To effectively implement Whole Class Reading using VIPERS, consider the following:

- Create a conducive learning environment: Ensure the classroom is comfortable and conducive to learning, with minimal distractions.
- Choose engaging texts: Select texts that are interesting and relevant to the students' lives, with opportunities for discussion and analysis.
- Use multimedia integration: Incorporate videos, images, and interactive games to introduce and practice VIPERS skills.
- Encourage active participation: Foster a sense of community and encourage students to participate in discussions and activities.



### **Differentiation Strategies**

#### To cater to diverse learning needs, consider the following differentiation strategies:

- Visual aids: Use images, diagrams, and charts to support visual learners.
- Audio support: Provide audio recordings of the text for students who require additional support.
- Scaffolding: Offer temporary support and guidance to students who need it, gradually increasing independence.
- Challenge activities: Provide additional challenges for students who require more complexity and depth.



### **Assessment Opportunities**

#### To evaluate student understanding and progress, consider the following assessment opportunities:

- Quizzes: Administer quizzes to assess students' understanding of new vocabulary and VIPERS skills.
- Class discussions: Engage in class discussions to assess students' ability to retell main events and demonstrate understanding of VIPERS skills.
- Written tasks: Assign written tasks, such as summarising or explaining a text, to assess students' ability to apply VIPERS skills.



### **Time Management Considerations**

- Introduction and context (10 minutes): Introduce the text and provide context.
- Reading and discussion (20 minutes): Read the text aloud and engage in class discussions.
- Activities and practice (20 minutes): Engage in activities and practice VIPERS skills.
- Conclusion and assessment (10 minutes): Conclude the lesson and assess student understanding.
