



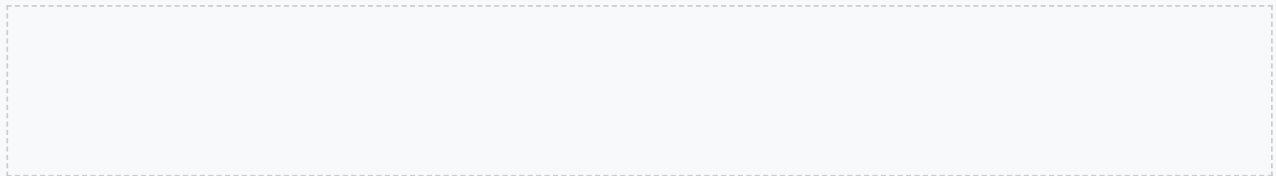



Farm Animal Characteristics


