Introduction

Welcome to our lesson on Introduction to Transportation Vocabulary and Basic Concepts for 3-Year-Olds: Exploring Wheels, Wings, and Water. This lesson plan is designed to introduce 3-year-old children to basic transportation vocabulary and concepts, focusing on land, air, and water transportation. The key learning objectives include recognizing and identifying different modes of transportation, understanding their uses, and developing essential vocabulary related to transportation.

Lesson Objectives

- Recognize and identify at least 5 different modes of transportation (e.g., car, bus, train, airplane, boat)
- Understand the basic functions of different modes of transportation
- Develop essential vocabulary related to transportation
- · Apply transportation vocabulary in context through interactive activities and play

Materials and Resources

- Transportation picture flashcards
- Toy models of different vehicles (car, bus, train, airplane, boat)
- Transportation-themed storybooks
- Vocabulary worksheet
- Digital transportation games and apps
- Interactive whiteboard and software
- Safety materials (e.g., helmets, seatbelts)

ELL/ESL Support Strategies

- · Use visual aids and real-life pictures to support learning
- Provide extra practice and review for ELL/ESL students
- Use simple language and repetition to reinforce learning

Lesson Introduction (10 minutes)

- 1. Introduction and Welcome (2 minutes)
 - o Greet each student and ask how they are doing
 - o Show a picture related to transportation and ask if they know what it is
- 2. Vocabulary Introduction (4 minutes)
 - o Introduce key transportation vocabulary (car, bus, train, airplane, boat)
 - Use flashcards and real-life pictures to support learning
 - Ask students to repeat the vocabulary words
- 3. Story Time (4 minutes)
 - Read a simple, interactive storybook about transportation
 - o Ask students to point out and name the vehicles they see

Activity Stations (20 minutes)

- 1. Transportation Sorting Game (5 minutes)
 - o Provide a set of pictures or toys of different vehicles
 - Ask students to sort them into categories (land, air, water)
- 2. Vehicle Match (5 minutes)
 - o Prepare a set of vocabulary cards with the names of the vehicles
 - o Ask students to match the vocabulary card with the correct picture card
- 3. Transportation Charades (5 minutes)
 - o Divide the class into two teams
 - Write the names of different vehicles on slips of paper
 - Have each student take a turn drawing a slip and acting out the vehicle without speaking
- 4. Transportation Route Planning (5 minutes)
 - o Provide a large, blank map or a simple grid representing a town
 - o Give students toy vehicles and ask them to plan a route from one point to another

Conclusion and Review (10 minutes)

- 1. Review Transportation Vocabulary (5 minutes)
 - Show students the flashcards again and ask them to name each vehicle
 - Use simple language and repetition to reinforce learning
- 2. Reflect on Learning (3 minutes)
 - Ask students to share what they learned about transportation
 - o Discuss the importance of transportation in our daily lives
- 3. Closing Activity (2 minutes)
 - Sing a transportation-themed song or read a transportation-themed book
 - Encourage students to share their favorite mode of transportation

Assessment and Evaluation

- Observe students during activities and note their ability to identify and name different vehicles
- Use the vocabulary worksheet to assess students' recognition and spelling of transportation vocabulary
- Evaluate students' understanding of basic transportation concepts through class discussions and activities
