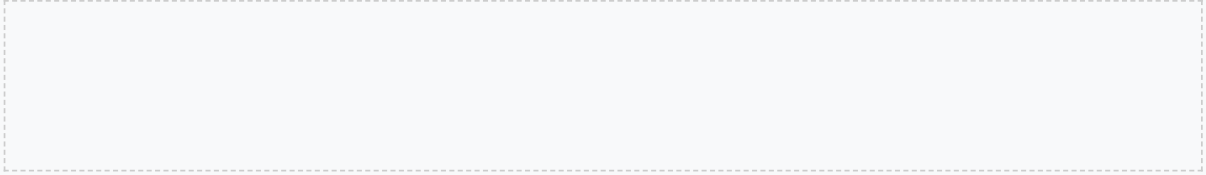

## Empathy and Historical Perspective (20 minutes)

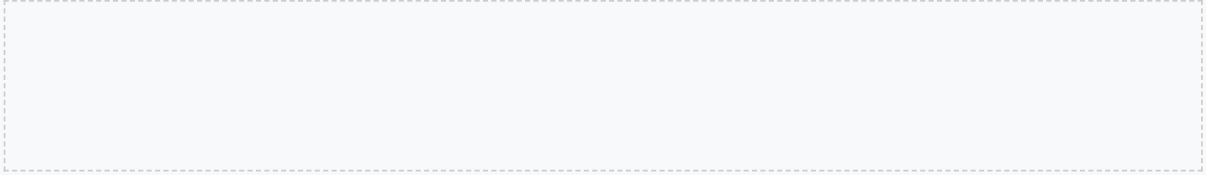
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Answer the following questions:

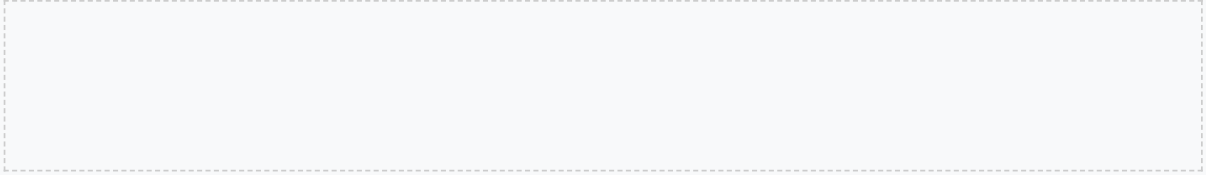

## Case Study (25 minutes)

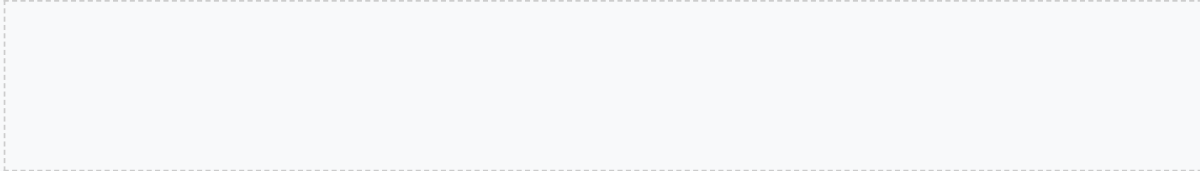
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Research and present on a specific aspect of the impact of World War 2 on civilians and society:
