## **Essential Questions & Big Ideas**

#### **Essential Questions:**

- · How do movies and series reflect and shape our understanding of the world?
- What role do media play in shaping our cultural values and norms?

### **Enduring Understandings:**

- Movies and series can be used as a tool for social commentary and critique.
- Effective communication and critical thinking are essential for meaningful discussions about media.

## **Pre-Lesson Preparation**

#### **Room Setup:**

- · Arrange desks in a circle for group discussions
- Set up a projector and screen for presentations

#### **Technology Needs:**

- · Computer with internet access
- · Projector and screen

#### **Materials Preparation:**

- · Whiteboard markers
- · Handouts with guiding questions

#### **Safety Considerations:**

### **Detailed Lesson Flow**

#### **Introduction and Warm-Up (10 minutes)**

### **Vocabulary Building (15 minutes)**

## Presentation (20 minutes)

- Presentations: Allow students to present their work, encouraging feedback and discussion

## **Conclusion and Feedback (10 minutes)**

- Class Discussion: Hold a class discussion on what was learned, highlighting key phrases and vocabulary used during the activities
- Feedback: Provide feedback on participation and engagement, and encourage students to reflect on their own learning

### **Lesson Introduction**

The lesson on speaking about movies and series is introduced with a hook to grab the students' attention, such as asking about their favorite movie or series and why they enjoy it. This initial engagement strategy sets the tone for an interactive and student-centered lesson.

# **Lesson Objectives**

The learning objectives for this lesson are:

- To develop conversational skills through discussions about movies and series
- To improve vocabulary related to films and series
- To enhance critical thinking and analysis of movie and series themes and characters
- To promote effective communication, teamwork, and respect for diverse opinions



# **Vocabulary Introduction**

Introduce key vocabulary related to movies and series, such as genres, characters, and film-making terms. Provide definitions and examples to help students understand the vocabulary.

# **Vocabulary Matching Game**

Prepare a matching game where students match vocabulary words with their definitions. This activity helps students to practice using the vocabulary in context.



# **Group Discussion**
