

Introduction (5 minutes)

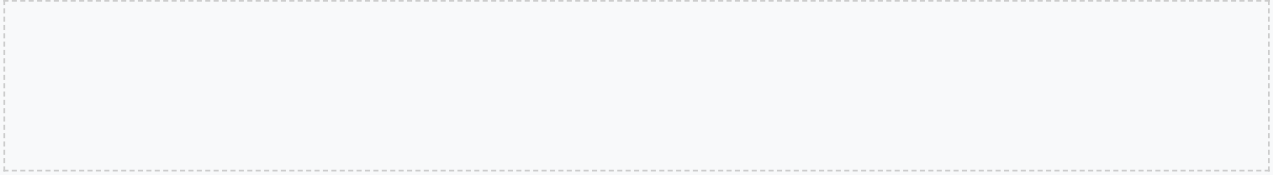
Read the introduction to the worksheet and discuss with your partner:

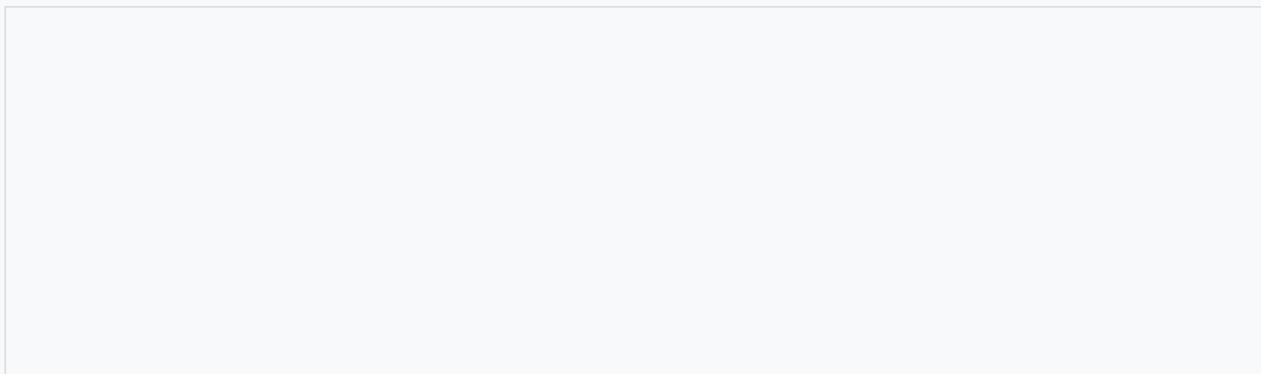

Find and circle the following words in the word search puzzle:

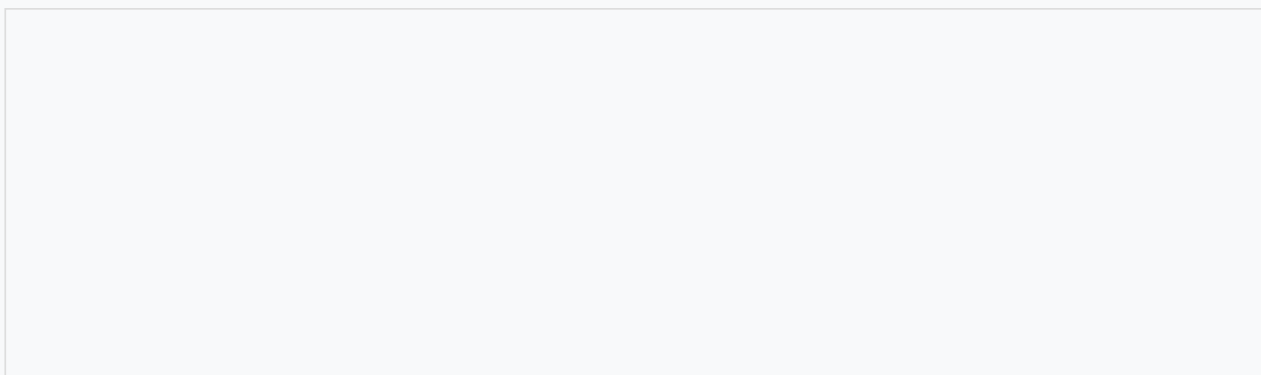
Big, Small, Happy, Sad, Fast, Slow
