Introduction



Activity 2: Drawing and Description


Draw a picture of your favorite land vehicle and write a short description about why you like it. Consider the following questions:

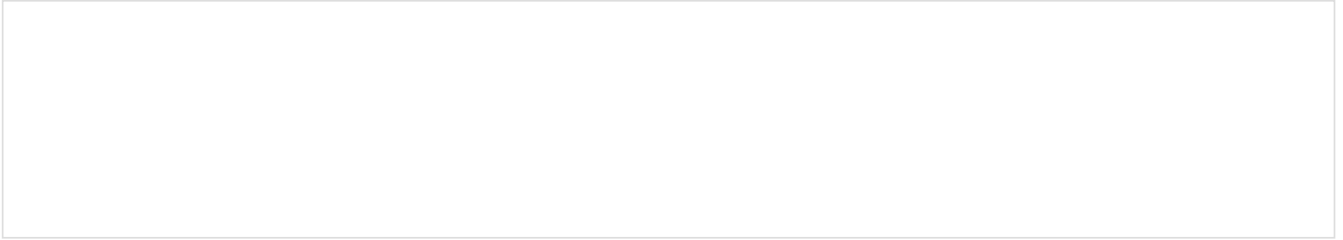
Activity 3: Vehicle Scavenger Hunt
