- 3. Complex sentence: a sentence that has an independent clause and one or more dependent clauses

## **Clause Structure**

A clause is a group of words that contains a subject and a predicate. There are two main types of clauses:

- 1. Independent clause: a clause that has a subject and a predicate and can stand alone as a complete sentence
- 2. Dependent clause: a clause that has a subject and a predicate but cannot stand alone as a complete sentence

## **Clause Identification**

Identify the independent and dependent clauses in the following sentence:

Because I forgot my lunch, I had to buy a sandwich.

## **Grammar Rules**

Grammar rules are the guidelines that govern the structure of language. Some important grammar rules include:

- Subject-verb agreement: the subject and verb must agree in number
- Tense consistency: the verb tense must be consistent throughout a sentence or paragraph
- Punctuation usage: punctuation marks must be used correctly to separate words, phrases, and clauses
