Advanced Concepts

Case Study: The Development of the Internet

The internet was first developed in the 1960s by the United States Department of Defense. In the 1980s, the internet was opened to the public, and it has since become a global network of interconnected computers and servers.

Example: Using the Past Simple Tense to Describe Complex Actions

The past simple tense can be used to describe complex actions and events in the past. For example: "I developed my first app in 2010, and it was a simple game that I created using Java." This sentence describes a complex action (developing an app) and uses the past simple tense to indicate that the action was completed in the past.
