Activity 3: Writing Your Short Story


Continue writing your short story. What happens next? What challenges does your character face?

Writing can be fun and interactive. Here are a few activities and games to help you get started:


Word Association Game:

Write down a word and then write a story using as many related words as possible.




Story Starters:
