Pre-Lesson Preparation

Room Setup:

- Gallery walk

Direct Instruction (20-25 mins)

- Present the basics of English grammar (parts of speech, sentence structure, verb tenses)
- Use multimedia resources (videos, images, audio clips) to illustrate each concept

Checking for Understanding:

- Formative assessments (quizzes, class discussions)

- Summative assessments (tests, projects)

Guided Practice (25-30 mins)

- Have students work in pairs to construct their own sentences using the learned grammar rules
- Circulate around the room to provide guidance and feedback

Scaffolding Strategies:

- Provide sentence stems or frames
- Offer one-on-one support

Independent Practice (20-25 mins)

- Have students complete a writing activity (paragraph or short essay) applying the learned grammar rules
- Allow students to share their work with a partner or the class

Closure (10 mins)

- Review the key concepts and takeaways from the lesson
- Provide feedback and encouragement
