- Discuss subject-verb agreement

## Segment 4: Interactive Grammar Challenge (10 minutes)

### Grammar Detective Challenge:

- Divide class into teams of 4
- Provide complex sentence sets
- Teams must:
  - Identify all nouns and verbs
  - Classify each word's specific type
  - Explain grammatical reasoning

### Challenge Scoring:

Criteria	Points
Correct Noun Identification	2 points
Correct Verb Identification	2 points
Detailed Explanation	3 points
Team Collaboration	3 points

### Sample Challenge Sentences:

1. "The curious scientist explored mysterious caves."
2. "Happiness radiates from her brilliant smile."
3. "Technology transforms educational landscapes rapidly."

### Linguistic Complexity: Beyond Basic Classification

Grammar is not merely about labeling words, but understanding their intricate relationships and contextual transformations.

### Contextual Word Function Transformation

#### Base Word: "Run"

- Verb: "She will run marathon."
- Noun: "Her daily run improves fitness."

#### Base Word: "Light"

- Noun: "The light illuminates room."
- Verb: "We light candles ceremonially."
- Adjective: "Light breeze feels pleasant."

#### Linguistic Flexibility Principles:

1. Words can change grammatical function based on context
2. Sentence position determines word role
3. Understanding context is crucial for accurate interpretation

### Sample Assessment Questions:

1. Identify and classify the nouns and verbs in: "Brave explorers discover hidden treasures."

Expected Response:

- Nouns: "explorers", "treasures"
- Verbs: "discover"

2. Transform the word "dance" into different grammatical functions.

Possible Transformations:

- Verb: "They dance gracefully."
- Noun: "Her dance was mesmerizing."
