Read the following text: "Women played a crucial role in the war effort, taking on new responsibilities in the workforce, military, and home front."

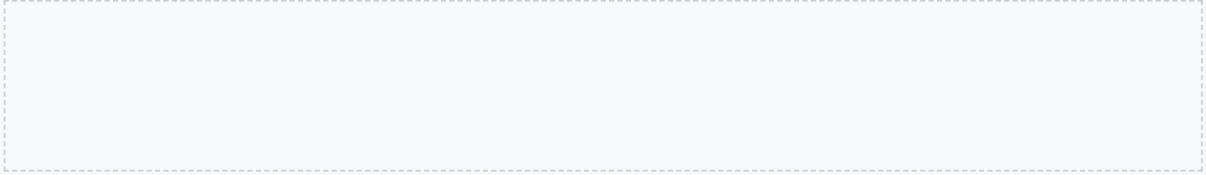

Exchange your reflective essay with a partner or in a small group.

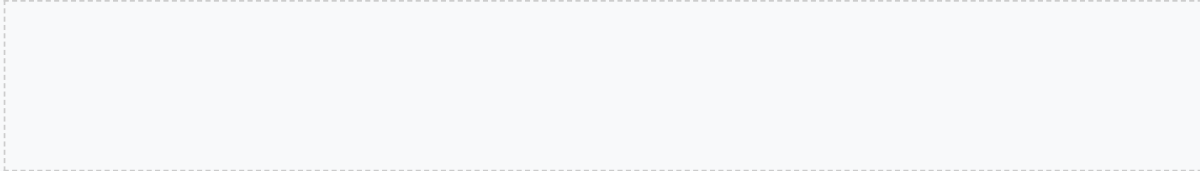
Read and provide feedback on each other's essays, using the following guiding questions:
