Essential Questions & Big Ideas

Essential Questions:

- How can I use gerunds and verb patterns to express my opinions and preferences?
- · What are the benefits of effective communication in real-life situations?

Detailed Lesson Flow

Introduction (10 minutes)

- Introduce the topic of career choices and preferences

Vocabulary Review (15 minutes)

Gerunds and Verb Patterns

Definition:

Gerunds are verbs that end in -ing and function as nouns in a sentence.

Examples:

- Playing soccer is my favorite hobby
- · She enjoys traveling to new countries

Verb Patterns with Gerunds

Definition:

Verb patterns with gerunds are used to describe activities, hobbies, or interests.

Examples:

- I love playing soccer
- She hates doing homework



Career Choices and Preferences

Definition:

Career choices and preferences are an important part of conversational dialogue, as they allow individuals to express their thoughts and feelings about their future plans and goals.

Examples:

- I want to be a doctor because I enjoy helping people
- She wants to study engineering because she loves solving problems

Using Gerunds and Verb Patterns to Discuss Career Choices and Preferences

Examples:

- I am considering pursuing a career in medicine because I enjoy helping people
- She is thinking about studying engineering because she loves solving problems



Practice Activity

Instructions:

- 1. Divide students into pairs and provide a conversation scenario related to career choices and preferences
- 2. Ask students to take turns practicing their conversational dialogue using gerunds and verb patterns

Example Conversation Scenario:
