Pre-Lesson Preparation

Room Setup:

- · Arrange desks in a circle for group discussion
- · Prepare whiteboard and markers

Technology Needs:

- · Computer with internet access
- Projector and screen

Materials Preparation:

- · Vocabulary flashcards
- · Grammar handouts

Safety Considerations:

- · Ensure students are seated comfortably and safely

Detailed Lesson Flow

Introduction and Warm-Up (10 minutes)

- · Introduce the topic of daily routines
- Ask students about their favorite part of the day

Vocabulary Building (15 minutes)

- Presentation of new vocabulary
- · Students repeat and form simple sentences

Engagement Strategies:

- Provide guiding questions for discussion

Scaffolding Strategies:

- Use visual aids and sentence stems
- Encourage students to use vocabulary and grammar correctly

Role-Play (20 minutes)

- · Divide students into pairs or small groups
- · Assign different roles and scenarios related to daily routines

Conclusion and Feedback

Conclusion:

Review the key components of the lesson and ask students to reflect on their learning

Feedback:

Provide feedback on student participation and engagement





Assessment

Formative Assessment:

- Observe students during speaking activities and role-plays
- Collect students' written work, such as journals or schedules

Summative Assessment:

- Use a rubric to evaluate student participation, fluency, and accuracy
- · Assess student understanding of vocabulary and grammar

Extension Activities

Extension Activities:

- · Create a daily routine poster, including pictures and short sentences
- · Write a short story about a character's daily routine
