Relationships and Motivations

2. How does Juliet's relationship with her parents affect her actions?

3. What motivates Romeo and Juliet to make the choices they do in the play?

Quote Analysis

Read the following quote from the play and answer the questions that follow:

"What's in a name? That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet;" - Juliet (Act 2, Scene 2)

1. What does this quote reveal about Juliet's character?

2. How does this quote relate to the theme of love in the play?

Creative Writing

Imagine you are Romeo or Juliet. Write a diary entry or letter to a friend or family member, exploring your thoughts and feelings about the events of the play.

1. What are your hopes and fears for the future?

2. How do you feel about your family and their expectations of you?

Group Discussion

Discuss the following questions with your classmates:

1. What do you think is the most significant theme in *Romeo and Juliet*?

2. How do the characters' actions and decisions contribute to the tragic ending of the play?


3. What message do you think Shakespeare is trying to convey through the story of *Romeo and Juliet*?

Character Map

Create a character map, illustrating the relationships between Romeo, Juliet, and other characters in the play.

Include the following characters: Romeo, Juliet, Lord and Lady Capulet, Lord and Lady Montague, Friar Lawrence, Tybalt

Use arrows to show the relationships between characters and include a brief description of each relationship

1. Analyze the character development of Romeo or Juliet throughout the play. How do their experiences and relationships shape their personalities and decisions?

2. Discuss the theme of love in *Romeo and Juliet*. How do the characters' perceptions of love contribute to the tragic ending of the play?

2. Identify and explain two themes present in the play.
