

### Welcome to the Magical World of Drama and Theatre!

This lesson plan is designed to introduce 10-year-old students to the enchanting world of drama and theatre, focusing on building their creativity, confidence, and teamwork skills.

Through interactive games, engaging activities, and immersive experiences, students will explore the fundamentals of drama and theatre, laying the foundation for a lifelong appreciation of the performing arts.

#### Lesson Objectives:

- To introduce students to the basics of drama and theatre
- To develop students' creativity, confidence, and teamwork skills
- To encourage students to express themselves creatively and think outside the box



## Introduction and Icebreaker (Minutes 1-5)

Welcome students and introduce yourself

Explain the objectives of the lesson and the importance of drama and theatre

Play a fun and interactive icebreaker game, "Theatre Charades," to get students laughing and engaged

Introduce the concept of non-verbal communication and its significance in drama and theatre

## **Theatre Charades Game:**

Divide students into two teams

Write down different drama and theatre-related words or phrases (e.g. "act," "dance," "script") on slips of paper

Each team takes turns drawing a slip of paper and acting out the word or phrase without speaking

The team that correctly guesses the most words or phrases wins



# **Exploring Drama and Theatre (Minutes 6-10)**

Provide a brief introduction to the basics of drama and theatre, including acting, directing, and playwriting

Show a short video clip of a theatrical performance to spark students' interest and curiosity

Ask students to share their thoughts and impressions of the video clip, encouraging them to think critically about the performance

## **Theatre Terminology:**

Act: a part of a play or performance Director: the person responsible for overseeing the production of a play or performance Playwright: the person who writes the script for a play Script: the written text of a play or performance



# **Creative Expression (Minutes 11-15)**

Divide students into small groups and provide them with various props, such as hats, scarves, and masks

Ask each group to create a short skit using the props, encouraging them to express themselves creatively and think outside the box

Circulate around the groups to offer guidance and support, and encourage students to take risks and have fun

### **Tips for Creative Expression:**

Encourage students to use their imagination and creativity

Remind students that there are no right or wrong answers, only creative expressions

Emphasize the importance of teamwork and collaboration



## **Theatre Games (Minutes 16-20)**

Introduce a series of theatre games, such as "Freeze" and "Yes, And...," designed to promote teamwork, communication, and creativity

Explain the rules of each game and demonstrate examples

Encourage students to participate and engage with each other, emphasizing the importance of collaboration and mutual respect

#### **Theatre Games Examples:**

Freeze: students act out a scene and then freeze in place, and another student must then start acting from the frozen position

Yes, And ...: students take turns adding to a scene, starting with "yes" and then adding their own idea



# **Conclusion and Reflection (Minutes 21-25)**

Gather students together to reflect on their experiences

Ask them to share their favorite moments from the lesson and what they learned about drama and theatre

Provide feedback and encouragement, highlighting the importance of creativity, self-expression, and teamwork in the world of drama and theatre

### **Reflection Questions:**

What did you enjoy most about the lesson? What did you learn about drama and theatre? How can you apply what you learned to your everyday life?
